

L&I's Division of Occupational Safety & Health (DOSH) offers this training to help broaden worker safety and health knowledge in the agriculture industry.

Intended Audience/Participants: Agricultural workers

Objectives: Through this training, participants will become more knowledgeable about:

- Workplace hazards
- Employee/employer responsibilities
- How to file a complaint
- How to identify, abate, avoid and prevent job related hazards.

Program Content: Learn to avoid the “Top 5” agricultural hazards:

- Struck by machinery or an object
- Falls from height
- Caught in/between moving objects
- Pesticide exposure
- Improper use/lack of personal protective equipment (PPE)

Benefits:

- Safer workplaces, less incidents/accidents. The training promotes a culture of safety and health through peer training.
- DOSH-authorized trainers are typically people who have done the hands-on work.
- Upon successful completion, workers will receive a WISHA 10 for Agriculture Certification Card and certificate of completion.
- Training is intended and expected to be participatory.
- Trainers are able to tailor the training topics based on specific needs of their audience.
- Training is available in English and Spanish.

This training is voluntary. It does not meet the employer training requirements contained in the WAC standards. Some employers, unions, and various other jurisdictions may require workers to have this training to work on job sites and to fulfill their own safety training goals. Workers attend 10 content hours delivered by a DOSH-authorized trainer.

This course is available to all organizations and associations free of charge.
